## From the Chairman

The $70^{\text {th }}$ Anniversary of the Victory in Europe falls on Friday $8^{\text {th }}$ May. A variety of events have been arranged to mark the occasion and churches have been particularly invited to contribute to the commemoration with the ringing of bells. 11am on Saturday $9^{\text {th }}$ May is the proposed time, although any time over the weekend from the Friday through to the Sunday would be welcomed. There is of course a long tradition of church bells being rung for such moments of national significance, one that I hope we can proudly continue.

More locally, the District Striking Contest is coming up on $6^{\text {th }}$ June. It is being held on the newly restored bells at Bletsoe. There are two competitions held at the same time: one is for bands ringing a method and the other for bands ringing rounds (which can include call changes). Each band should be of six Sunday service ringers from the tower they are representing and the test pieces are of 120 changes. All bands are welcome to take part and extra listeners are always welcome. It can be interesting to listen carefully to the striking and see if you agree with the judged outcome. Striking is an aspect of ringing we may not always pay as much attention to as we should so it does no harm at all to be a listener outside now and again. Happily we certainly have some bands locally capable of some high standard striking so there should be some good ringing to listen to and, dare I say, aspire to match.

## Ronald E J Freeman 1933-2015

Ron Freeman, a former ringer at Kempston and Wootton, died on 11th March 2015 aged 81 years.

Ron was born and brought up at Box End, Kempston and as a teenager he learned to ring the bells at All Saints, Church, Kempston where his father, Ernest Freeman, was a ringer. He was a member of the Bedfordshire Association of Church Bell Ringers from 1948 to 1959 and from 1976 to 1979, and he rang three peals for the Bedfordshire Association - in 1949 (at Kempston), 1950 (at Stagsden), and 1953 (at Kempston for the Coronation of Queen Elizabeth II).

Ron served his apprenticeship as a pattern maker at W H Allen in Bedford and he subsequently worked as a pattern maker at Hobkirk's foundry in Kempston. When the Kempston bells were rehung in a new frame, Ron was a member of the Kempston Parish Church Bells Appeal Committee from 1976 to 1979. He played a valuable part in the rehanging scheme, including making the pattern for the 15 frame castings and (together with the late Jim Routledge) arranging for the castings to be machined and drilled, thus resulting in a considerable financial saving.

Ron is survived by his wife, Dorothy, who he married at Wootton Church in 1966. His funeral service took place at Norse Road Crematorium, Bedford on 26th March 2015.

Sue Silver said that young ringers meet on the $4^{\text {th }}$ Sunday of the month at different towers and all youngsters are welcome.

The C Edward Jeffries Memorial Trophy for a Young Ringer was awarded to Jonathan Nash of St Andrews, Bedford.

## Tailenders' Report 2015

Tailenders' February meeting was at Maulden on a grey February day. We were lucky that there was some heating on in the church so the non-ringers were quite comfortable. The bells didn't seem as easy going as in the past and the ringing reflected this. After three attempts, a touch of Plain Bob triples was abandoned. There was more success with Grandsire triples and the
 Stedman triples was successful on the second attempt. Rounds and call changes were also rung.

Lunch was at the Dog and Badger where we were made to feel extremely welcome. The very tasty food was served promptly and was good value at $£ 7.95$ for two courses.

Many thanks to Lynn and Martin Goodwin for organising everything so well.
In March we were ringing at Milton Ernest. It was a beautiful sunny, crisp day. The six bells did not go easily, possibly due to lack of lubrication, and most people found the back four extremely hard to ring. In spite of this we managed to ring a course of Cambridge minor, and touches of Plain Bob minor, Plain Bob doubles and Grandsire doubles as well as call changes. We finished with a course of Stedman doubles and down.

We ate at The Falcon in Bletsoe. The food was slightly more expensive than usual but generally it was of a very high standard and worth the money. Many thanks to Ann and Graham Boyle for organising everything this month.

Our April meeting was on a lovely Spring day but unfortunately a lot of people were away and unable to attend. This meant that we only had 11 ringers, rather disappointing for the organisers who had gone to so much trouble to find new and interesting towers.


Our first tower was St Stephen's in St Albans, a ground floor six. The tenor did drop a bit when in a method but otherwise they went well and we enjoyed ringing them. We rang Cambridge minor, Plain Bob doubles and minor and some Grandsire doubles.

Lunch was at the Chequers Inn in Redbourn. We hadn't booked in advance but despite this our meals were served quite swiftly and everyone enjoyed their selection from an extensive menu.


After lunch we drove to St Leonard's church in Flamstead. We had been given instructions so we let ourselves in and after dealing with the clock hammer we rang the bells up. This was not an easy task, the bells are long draught and the rope guides are very high. The third and the fifth were very difficult to ring and generally it was not a pleasant
experience. By general consent we rang for half an hour to grab the tower and then rang down and drove home.
