From the Chairman

Some of you will be aware that the position of BRF (Bell Restoration Fund) Treasurer was left vacant at the Annual District Meeting, with Andrew Dennison continuing his stewardship until a replacement could be identified. I am pleased to say that Martin Goodwin has agreed to take on the role and also to serve as our R J Sharp Bell Fund Representative and Association Bell Fund District Representative.

The R J Sharp Bell Fund is an Association fund that was established from a bequest some years ago. Whilst it can provide loans to churches for bell work, latterly it has mainly been used to fund training and educational work. The Code of Practice can be found in the Annual Report. The Association Bell Fund is of course recently established and yet to make a grant, but there is every chance an application for assistance with a project will be forthcoming this year.

Our own District BRF made no grants last year or even the year before. There is a very simple explanation why – there were no applications for grants. If you do have some bell work that you think the BRF may be able to help with the cost of, information of what can be covered and an application form are available from Bob Jones, the District Secretary. The District Committee studies any applications that are received and then makes a recommendation that goes to a vote at the next District business meeting.

Report of Annual Bedford District Meeting on 16 January 2016

He went on to thank Revd Stephen Huckle for conducting the Service and the use of the Church facilities, and Derek Hammond for playing the organ.

No deceased members were reported for this quarter.

The Minutes of the 2015 Annual District Meeting at Cardington were read, accepted and signed.



Presentation of C **Edward** Jeffries Memorial Trophy: the Committee had decided that Melissa Nash had progressed well during the last year, ringing her first peal, several quarter including peals one Grandsire Caters, and was now cinques exploring and maximus. Alex proudly presented her with the silver plate.

The District Report read by Alex Nash mentioned that in 2015 five members had succeeded in ringing their first peal: Melissa Nash, Jonathan Nash, Ian Townsend, George Saunders and Lisa Adams. The BRF report by Andrew Dennison and the Membership

report by Jenny Thompson were also presented and accepted. The programme up to May 2017 was circulated and approved.

Association President Sue Silver, Secretary Terry Brown and Treasurer Barbara Fraser were welcomed by Alex and gave updates on various Association matters including the Association striking contests, meetings of the General Committee, the 2015 Annual Report and the website. The young ringers' practices, Gift Aid on subscriptions which can be paid by standing order, and the Ringing World Survey were mentioned. The Biggleswade project is going ahead, with the casting of two new trebles, and the bells are expected to be ringing again sometime in April.

Under Any Other Business, Stephen Stanford said it was now 10 years since Eddie Jeffries had died, and a peal board for the peal rung to commemorate his ringing achievements was finally being organised. Any donations towards the cost would be gratefully received.

We started by ringing up the back six fairly competently. The lighter bells were then rung up separately. Because they are such a light eight, several ringers preferred to only ring the heavier bells.

We had two sets of call changes on the eight but the striking was not the best. We also rang Grandsire doubles and Plain Bob doubles on the back six and Grandsire triples and Plain Bob major but again there was no really good striking although there were few trips. In each case, the ringing improved as we went along. If we had spent all day there we might have managed some good ringing. The ringing down on all eight was reasonable.

Lunch was at The Pheasant, further along Kimbolton Road. We all ordered from the seniors' menu which was very good value at £6.95 for two courses and the portions were ample. The food was tasty and everyone appeared to enjoy their lunch.
